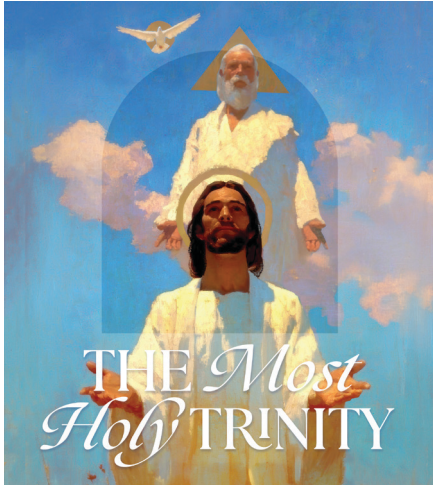

Of All Things...

Catechism 101

The Dogma of the Holy Trinity

We are continuing with an old series about our Catholic faith, called 'Catechism 101' mostly a summary from the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The purpose of the series is to refresh our knowledge on our set of beliefs.

This week, the key question is about the Holy Trinity.

'I believe in the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit'.

Do we believe in three Gods?

#253. The Trinity is one. We do not confess three Gods, but one God in three persons, the "consubstantial Trinity." The divine persons do not share the one divinity among themselves but each of them is God whole and entire.(...)

What is the distinction among these persons?

#254. The divine persons are really distinct from one another. (...) They

are distinct from one another in their relations of origin: 'It is the Father who generates, the Son who is begotten, and the Holy Spirit who proceeds.' (Lateran Council IV, 1215: DS 804). The divine Unity is Triune.

Wait a minute! If they are distinct, they must operate independently?

#256. The divine persons are relative to one another. Because it does not divide the divine unity, the real distinction of the persons from one another resides solely in the relationships which relate them to one another. (...)

It is hard to comprehend their distinction within their relations!

#261. The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

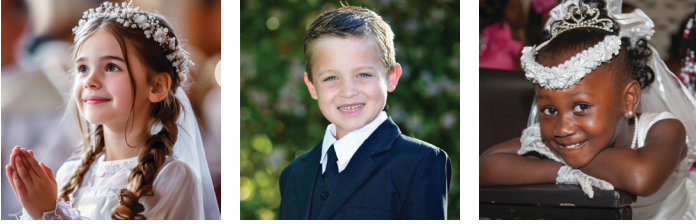


Vocations Chalice Program
