Of All Things...

Fear

The preaching of the Kingdom of God brought many disciples to embrace Christ and to follow a new way of life. Subsequently, the converts have faced oppositions and constraints from various sides. Persecutions have emerged from synagogue officials, from Roman authorities, and from some hostile groups.

Jesus has encouraged and prepared his followers to not let fear get the best of them. Today's gospel offers three reasons as to why the disciples should remain faithful in the face of hardship.

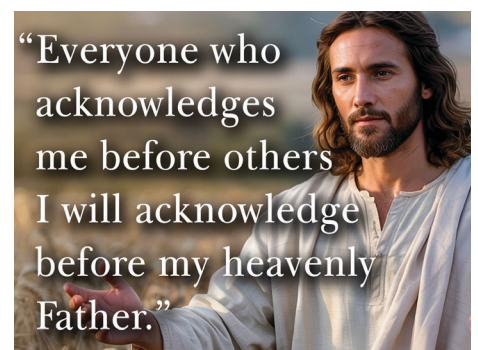
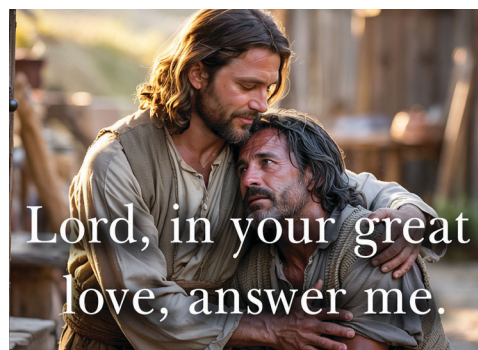
1. The imminent eschatological judgement will reveal everything. Therefore, there is no need to keep the Gospel a secret (Mt 10:26-27). Implied here that the truth of that gospel will also become known. Thus, do not fear what others might know. In fact, strive to make it public.
2. The opponent can cause bodily harm, but they cannot destroy the inner person. They cannot destroy one's faith. If the opponents had the power to destroy one's hope, faith and love, then fear would be fully justified, but in fact they cannot (Mt 10:28)
3. Disciples are highly valued by God and therefore God will care for them. This is supported by a traditional rabbinic method of arguing from the lesser to the greater. God cares for the sparrows which are worth only a few cents, therefore God will care all the more for the disciples who are more valuable than sparrows (Mt 10:29-31).

All in all, disciples who accept Jesus as the Son of God and remain faithful to him in the face of hardship and even persecutions will receive the grace needed to fulfill their commitment. Those who deny Christ as the Son of God have closed themselves off to what in fact they need the most.

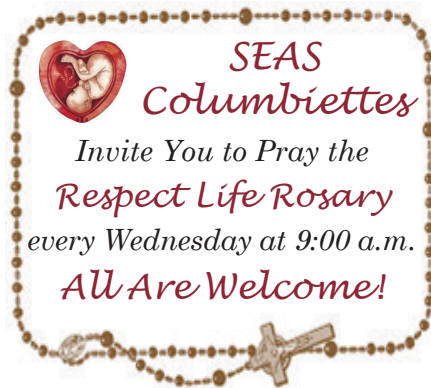

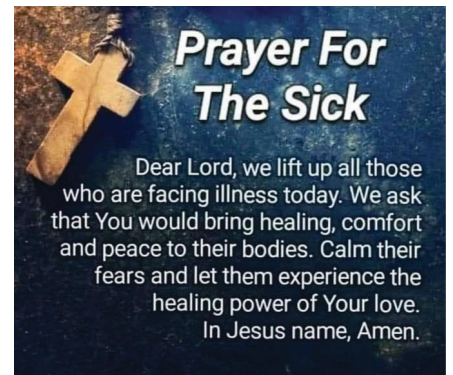

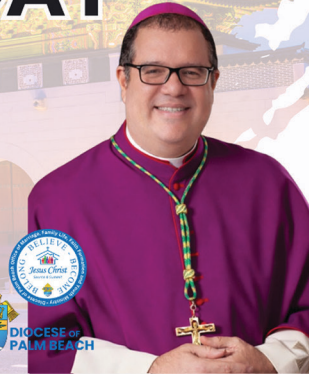
