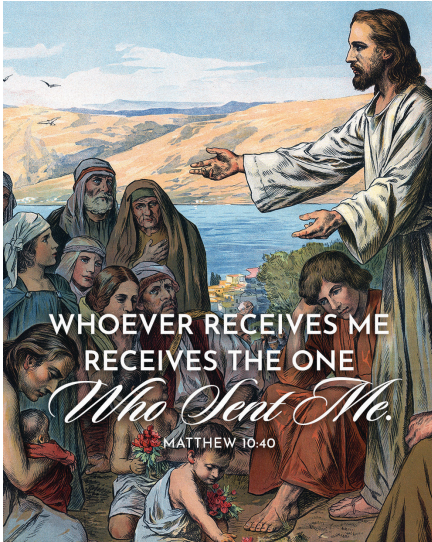

Of All Things...

Catechism 101

We go back to an old series about our Catholic faith, called 'Catechism 101' mostly a summary from the Catechism of the Catholic Church [CCC]. The purpose of the series is to refresh our knowledge on our set of beliefs.

This week, the key question is about forgiveness.

'I believe in the forgiveness of sins.'

How do I get rid of my sins?

Baptism is the first and the chief sacrament of the forgiveness of sins; it unites us to Christ, who died and rose and gives us the Holy Spirit.

What is the deal if I sin after baptism?

By Christ's will, the Church possesses the power to forgive the sins of the baptized and exercises it through bishops and priests normally in the sacrament of Penance.

In the forgiveness of sins, both priests and sacraments are instruments which our Lord Jesus Christ, the only author and liberal giver of salvation, wills to use in order to efface our sins and give us the grace of justification.

Where is that in the Bible?

In John 20:22-23, Jesus told his disciples: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

What are the names of this sacrament?

The forgiveness of sins committed after Baptism is conferred by a particular sacrament called the sacrament of conversion, confession, penance, or reconciliation.

What do I do to be reconciled with God and the Church?

The movement of return to God, called conversion and repentance, entails sorrow

for and abhorrence of sins committed, and the firm purpose of sinning no more in the future and is nourished by hope in God's mercy. One who desires to obtain reconciliation with God and with the Church, must confess to a priest all the unconfessed grave sins he remembers after having carefully examined his conscience. The confession of venial faults, without being necessary in itself, is nevertheless strongly recommended by the Church.

What is an indulgence?

An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints.

An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. Indulgences may be applied to the living or the dead.

How do I obtain an indulgence?

An indulgence is obtained through the Church who, by virtue of the power of binding and loosing granted her by Christ Jesus, intervenes in favor of individual Christians and opens for them the treasury of the merits of Christ and the saints to obtain from the Father of mercies the remission of the temporal punishments due for their sins. Thus, the Church does not want simply to come to the aid of these Christians, but also to spur them to works of devotion, penance, and charity.
